YouCubed - Tip #4 Encourage number sense. What separates high and low achievers is number sense having an idea of the size of numbers and being able to separate and combine numbers flexibly. For example, when working out 29 + 56, if you take one from the 56 and make it 30 + 55, it is much easier to work out.
