Thank you for your support in making sure the children have come back ready and prepared to learn. Please remember that we are wearing summer uniform this term, however the children can choose to wear sandals or shoes and socks. A gentle reminder that the summer uniform guidelines state that anything worn under the uniform must not be visible - this includes t-shirts, singlets, etc. Also, only small plain gold or silver studs and a plain watch are permissible as jewellery. Please be particularly vigilant with earrings as this is a health and safety concern.

Next week, children in Years 2~ 6 will be bringing home their portfolio books. With the ever increasing use of digital technology to record and store children's work, our portfolio books no longer fit the purpose they were originally intended for. These do not need to be sent back to school and can be kept at home as a record of the children's work.

An update on the Hall: As you will be aware, the Hall has been out of action since the floods in late October 2016. The School and Parish have worked together to try to minimise the impact on all groups using the Hall and the latest communications are that it should be back up and running in early March. After School Care has been operating out of the Staffroom and Room 8 and I would like to say thank you to both the staff and community for being so flexible with this. While this temporary accommodation is in place, we have asked the children to be aware of the After School programme moving around the school and to be respectful of their equipment which may be in the playground.

We are all looking forward to seeing you tonight at some or all of our planned evening. Classrooms will be open from 4pm-5pm for you to wander through with your children and chat to teachers. From 5pm ~ 6pm we will be having a picnic dinner on the field and from 6pm ~ 7pm, a presentation on our new KiVa programme.

Tomorrow the sun is going to shine and we are going to the beach! Children can come to school in beach mufti and all other details are as per last week.

On Tuesday evening, the staff attended a Commissioning Mass in the Cathedral with all the other schools in the diocese. Cardinal John spoke to us about working to the best of our ability with a big heart and humour. These are great reminders for us all to start the year with.
