## Board update from John Mallon, Chairperson Board of Trustees

It's crazy that we are now already well into the last term of 2017. The Board held its second to last meeting of the year last Wednesday. The BoT has commenced its 3 yearly Charter and Strategic Plan review and is aiming to sign this off by the start of 2018. This review will establish the strategic priorities for the School over the next 3 years. We will keep you updated on progress.

The BoT has approved some capex on the School pool, with a service to the pump and filter overdue and the cover to be upgraded. This should get the pool fully operational and ready for the summer onslaught.

Last week's meeting was sadly the final meeting for Dan O'Hagan. Dan joined the board in November 2011 and is stepping down in December. He has made a huge contribution to the BoT and the School as a trustee and parent. Dan has been the lead for the BoT on many of the large projects undertaken over the last 5 - 6 years, including the playground upgrade and relocation, the Learning Hub, the new equipment shed and other projects. The School has been extremely lucky to have had access to Dan's skill and expertise and we cannot thank him enough. He will be missed. Finally, as you well know, election day for the Board of Trustees is 1st December, with nominations closing on 17th November. Please do consider putting your name forward for the role of trustee.
