Kia ora and welcome back to you all. It has been wonderful having all the children back looking refreshed and excited to begin another year of learning. We are all enjoying the buzz and atmosphere of this new school year. We are mindful however that the end of the summer break can take a bit of time for many to adjust to. Please talk to your child's teacher if there is anything you are concerned or not sure about.

We will be holding our Information Evening on Tuesday, 26 February, 5pm - 7pm here at school. We will have a sausage sizzle at 5pm and then move into the Hall to meet the staff and talk about our initiatives for 2019. After this there will be opportunities to meet with Pod teachers to hear a more detailed outline of the class programme. We will have child care available and would love to see you all here.

This year we will be working with the Ministry of Education using their PB4L (Positive Behaviour for Learning) Framework. We are very fortunate to have been offered access to the resources available to help us as a Community to streamline our values and school-wide expectations. We will be sharing more information with you as we work through the year.

One of our major staff professional development areas this year will be Te Reo Maori/Tikanga Maori. We have engaged Alice Fitzpatrick from Arahia Associates to work with us and we are excited to begin sharing this learning with the children.

Sadly at the end of last year Te Po, our Kapa Haka tutor left to move to Dunedin. We were very fortunate to have had such a high level of support from him and are very pleased to be able to continue Kapa Haka with the support of Anthony Urwin from Aotea College. Matua Anthony will be working with us on Mondays and supporting us to grow our understanding of Kapa Haka and enhance our performance bracket. We are very grateful for the support offered to us, through our involvement in the Northern Porirua Kahui Ako.

Tomorrow is our annual start of the year Beach Picnic. Unfortunately the Taupo Stream end of the beach is not safe to swim in and we have decided to walk down to Karehana Bay beach. We will leave school at 10.00am to walk to Karehana Bay and will leave the beach at 2pm to walk back to school. We are still in need of adult helpers to walk with us and help in the water. Yesterday many of the staff attended an interesting and highly relevant session with Nathan Wallace, focusing on the brain and anxiety in both young children and teenagers.
