Principal's Note

This week we have continued our 3-way learning conversations and I would like to thank you all for taking the time to come in and talk with your child's teacher. This is what helps to strengthen our home/school partnership. As you are aware, we have changed the way we are reporting to you on your child's progress in Literacy, Numeracy and the Key Competencies using SeeSaw. This new style of reporting has come from much robust discussion with you, our community and the need to provide 'on time', relevant, annotated examples of work. We will continue to use SeeSaw this term to report against the broader strands of the New Zealand Curriculum through the Key Competencies and will be seeking your feedback on how this has worked for you.

There has been a lot of discussion in the media recently around the Government's decision to fund schools \$150 per child, if the school does not ask parents for any donations or costs towards a child's learning. While this initiative has merit, unfortunately it is not an option for all schools as it is only available to decile 1-7 schools. St Theresa's is ranked as a decile 10 school, therefore we do not qualify to apply for the funding. This means we are in a position of still needing to ask for the voluntary contribution and costs associated with providing a high quality educational programme that allows students to 'be the best they can be'. Thank you to those of you who have already paid these contributions and please remember if you require support with these costs, I am always happy to talk to you about options for payment.

While on the topic of the media - I'm sure you are all aware that Primary Principals have still not been able to settle our collective agreement. There is ongoing negotiation between the NZEI and the Ministry of Education and much discussion around industrial action, etc. Please be assured that the school is in good heart. We are continuing to put the children's learning at the centre of everything we do and all core business is being attended to. I pray for a speedy resolution to the negotiations.

On Sunday we will be having our 2nd Working Bee here at school starting at 1pm and going until about 3pm. The old saying 'many hands make light work' couldn't be truer and we are hoping to have another big turnout. Aside from the water blasting, we have a huge range of jobs that need completing so don't worry - there's something for everyone. We also offer a slice of pizza and a beer for afters, so it's well worth popping down for an hour or two.

Today and Friday I am in the Wairarapa at the Wellington Catholic Primary Principals Conference, so I wish you all a happy and safe weekend.


