At St Theresa's we have 1 Within School Teacher (WSTs) position that is shared by Jo Beasley and Pauline MacLean. Jo and Pauline shared the portfolios of Innovation and Culture.

Leadership: Our foundation Lead Principal, Bradley Roberts, has just completed his two year term. Bradley has done a great job of building connections and relationships across our Kāhui Ako. Lead Principal: Mark Smith is the new Kāhui Ako Lead Principal. Across School Teachers (ASTs): We have five across school teachers who can provide mentoring, resources, connections and support for learners in schools. ASTs are released 0.4 to work in schools. Teachers and principals can contact ASTs directly.

Catherine Collins Catherine is the HOD of Art at Aotea College. She supports learners and teachers in our Well-Being and Pathways workstreams, particularly in the Arts and is establishing a network for SENCo.

Anthony Urwin Anthony is a teacher of Māori at Aotea College. He supports learners and teachers in our Well-Being and Pathways workstreams, particularly in Te reo me ngā tikanga Māori and is establishing a student cultural leadership group.

Rachel Berney Rachel is a teacher at Discovery School. She supports learners and teachers in our Well-Being and Pathways workstreams, particularly with Early Childhood transitions and is establishing a student cultural leadership group.

Mark is a teacher at Adventure School. He supports learners and teachers in our Innovation workstream, particularly with digital learning.

Tom Fanning Tom is a teacher of Science at Aotea College. He supports learners and teachers in our Innovation workstream, particularly with science.

Each school also has Within School Teachers (WSTs) aligned to our workstreams. Schools manage this resource independently.


Next week I will share information on what's currently happening in the 3 work streams across schools.


