With the recent outbreak of measles moving it's way down through the country, it is important that we are all aware of how to protect ourselves and our children against an outbreak closer to home. From 1st January 2019 to 11th September 2019 there have been 1172 confirmed cases of measles notified across New Zealand. 970 of these confirmed cases are in the Auckland region. We currently have 22 confirmed cases in Wellington. The symptoms of measles include:

- Fever
- Cough
- Runny nose
- Sore and watery 'pink eyes'

Rash

Immunisation is the best way to protect against getting measles. The Measles (MMR) vaccination is free to everyone under the age of 50 and 99 percent effective after two doses. Children in New Zealand normally get the MMR vaccine at 15 months and 4 years old as part of the national vaccine schedule. If you are unsure about your own or your children's vaccination status, you can contact your GP and they will be able to give you up to date records. Also anyone travelling needs to be vigilant, particularly traveling to Auckland or overseas. We will continue to update you if there is any further information for schools from the Ministry of Health or Ministry of Education. Kia pai te wiki


