The staff started the school year with a retreat in Featherston, where we stayed overnight in an historical building called Fareham House. We were able to make, create and rejuvenate as a team, learning to weave flax and paint and create.

This year our major focus for our staff professional development will be Dramatic Inquiry and Digital Technology. We have already begun workshops and planning in Dramatic Inquiry so I look forward to seeing the children engaging in this work. We will be working with our Kahui Ako on implementing the NZ Digital Technology Curriculum over the next 2 years with support from CORE Education and the staff are very excited about this new learning.

We will be using the Schoolzine platform this year to publish our newsletter and they have developed an App that you can download onto your phone to make receiving and reading school notices, etc. much simpler. This is currently work in progress and we have attached information on how to download the App. Once we have the majority of people accessing the App, we will switch over to using that system.
