BOARD TALK

Pelcome back to school for a new year. I hope you all had a relaxing break over Christmas and New Year. We had our first board meeting of the year last week. We discussed our student achievement results from 2019. There is still some analysis to be done and these will be presented to the Board at our next meeting. They are looking good and we are committed to continue the positive results we have seen in recent years. We also discussed the redevelopment plans for the playground and the junior block. We are finally at a stage where we can start the playground redevelopment with the removal of the Littlie in late March. This is going to be a longer term project to get to our overall goal due to the cost but it is exciting to get Stage 1 started. We will also be looking at progressing the junior block redevelopment later in the year, once the plans are completed and consents gained.

he meeting spent a lot of time going over the budget for the year. This is a really important process. What is clear to us all is that, as with most schools, the budget is really tight. Every cent we have is allocated and there is very little wiggle room. To that end I would ask that we all pay our family contributions that have been sent out in the first week of school. There is some talk that the Government is now paying this. **That is not the case**. We are not included in this, which is the case with most schools in our area. This contribution is a vital part in enabling us to provide a wellrounded and vibrant education to our kids, meaning they are more likely to prosper and succeed in the future. Without this contribution we would have to cut back on some of the things we offer or are able to do for the kids, which is not what we want as a board, not what our teachers want and certainly not good for our kids. So I ask you to please make sure those contributions are paid.

arnival is also coming up very fast. We had an update from Jenny Jermy about the progress. We are still very short on people helping in various areas. Make sure you sign up to help on the day. It isn't difficult work and is actually a fun day when you are working there. Even if it is just for a couple of hours that would be appreciated.
