## SWIMMING SPORTS SURVEY RESULTS: YEARS 3-6

## 23 responses

20 ( $87 \%$ ) prefer Cannon's Creek as a venue and $\mathbf{1}$ (4.5\%) didn't mind either way. Two ( $\mathbf{9} \%$ ) preferred it at St Theresa's Pool.
18 ( $78 \%$ ) prefer it to be a Y4-6 competition rather than a Year 3-6 competition.
$18(78 \%)$ are supportive of a later finish, $2(9 \%)$ didn't mind either way and $2(9 \%)$ did not support a later finish. Almost all comments about Cannon's Creek as the venue were positive and supportive. The larger pool which provided a greater challenge to students was seen as a good thing. It stretched them in their ability. Ease of watching was another positive - plenty of space and great views for all onlookers. Parents were appreciative of Trish Fitzsimons' hard work in organising the event which they enjoyed and which ran well.

## Suggestions for improvement :

- Timing. Better use of time was a common suggestion. If there were no width races (no Year 3 races) there would be enough time for the House relays and medleys. There was disappointment that we ran out of time for these as they are very popular with students and parents and House relays in particular are seen as important to the occasion.
- Only one student per lane as it is a disadvantage to have two in a lane.
- House Groups sitting more closely in a bunch (rather than stretched out in one row) to give a greater sense of "team."
- Expression of issues about the "rules" - clarity needed prior to the event about what constitutes a win/place (Correct stroke? Standing up mid length?)
Students being allowed to get changed if they were cold.
