Thank you all for supporting the staff on Friday with our professional development day. This was a fantastic opportunity to review the work we have been doing over the past several years and to begin planning for the next 3 year cycle. We are currently looking at teacher and student placements, and reviewing some of the initiatives we have been trialling. Our students' academic, social, emotional, physical and spiritual well - being has always been at the heart of everything we do and will continue to be our firm focus. Please feel confident about this as we navigate the very probable changes to our education system and talk to us if you are unsure about anything.

Right across the school we are implementing a 'play-based' approach to teaching the New Zealand Curriculum. This will mean some small changes to timetables and how things look. Rest assured your children are still being taught the explicit skills and knowledge they need to be fully literate and numerate at the end of their time here.

Date change - we are really excited to share our digital learning journey with you on Tuesday, 7 November from 5.15p.m. - 7p.m. We have decided to move this from Tuesday, 31st October as there was a potential clash with that date. This will be a mixture of information sharing and hands-on activities. We plan to start with a free sausage sizzle at 5.15p.m., share a short clip on future-focussed education, break out into groups that demonstrate learning in things from Seesaw to Makerspace and finish with a Kahoot! on what you have learned. The children are very welcome. Please fill in the 2 question survey on attendance so that we can ensure we have adequate space and sausages.
