Board Talk from John Mallon, Chairperson, Board of Trustees

The Board of Trustees had its first meeting for the 4th Term last week. Where has the year gone?

As you will know, the Board has undertaken consultation with the community on the Charter and Strategic Plan review process. This included sessions with our staff, faith community and School community. We want to thank those people who gave up their valuable time to attend the sessions and share their thoughts on the School and contributed many bold ideas for the future.

The Board has a planning day on 17th November with the Strategic Plan to be finalised in February and presented to the Community in March 2019.

The Board would like to remind the community that the NZEI has signalled further stop-work action for all primary teacher and principal members via full day regional rolling strikes over 12th -16th November, 2018. The stop-work action will be dependent on further negotiation between NZEI and the Government, which we hope is successful but may not be confirmed until closer to 12th November.

The Board has again made the decision to close the School on the day of the strike, which would be Friday, 16th November, 2018. We will provide further update once we know whether the stop-work action is proceeding.

Finally, I would like to especially acknowledge Jenny Jermy, who through her hard work has successfully secured grants totalling over \$25,000 for the new playground, upgrade of the pool and kapa haka uniforms. We cannot thank her enough.
