The children loved the opportunity to watch how the container was lifted off the truck and positioned, and open the doors to look inside. We also thank the Trust House Foundation for approving our grant application and supporting us in the work we are beginning to undertake to create an amazing outdoor environment for our children. The container will be used in the short term for storage for the Carnival. Then we will incorporate it into our outdoor plan.
