From the cradle to the grave, we are forever learning.




The Lenten journey begins on Ash Wednesday. I invite each of you to live this time in an authentic spirit of penance and conversion, like a return to the Father, who awaits us all with open arms. - Pope Francis

Our School is a KiVa school. What does that mean? We are part of the KiVa programme where we have zero tolerance towards bullying. We have a twofold approach to achieving this.

<u>Prevention</u>: Prevention such as student lessons and online games, is directed at all students, with a focus on changing the role of the bystanders.

Intervention: Schools need effective tools when a case of bullying comes to light.

Intervention is used when a bullying case is identified. It is targeted specifically to the children/adolescents who have been involved in bullying as perpetrators or victims, as well as to several classmates who are challenged to support the victim. The aim is to put an end to bullying.



During Lent, we can think more carefully about how we spend our time. We might choose to spend more time and energy on activities that lead us to God. Jesus' response to the devil's temptations reminds us that God is to take priority in our lives. Our Lenten practices prepare us to choose God above everything else in our lives.


