Great news ....there are only 2 sleeps to go until our much anticipated 2019 Carnival. The Carnival team have been working very hard to make this a huge success and we are nearly there. Don't forget to sign up for a job on the day if you haven't already done so and remind your friends and family to come along from 10am to 2pm on Saturday.

The staff will be involved in Te Reo Maori/Tikanga Maori PD throughout the year. This term, we have been learning the importance of pepeha simple sentence structures to ask and answer who you are and where you come from. These lessons are then shared in class with the children, so check in with your them about what they are learning. Te Reo Maori is unique to Aotearoa New Zealand and our point of difference to the rest of the world - *Dr Wayne Ngata*.

On Tuesday, 19 March, we will be holding our Immersion Day to launch our inquiry. We are looking at Captain Cook's voyages of discovery and will have a range of activities happening around the school - (there's a rumour there could even be a goat!). The children are asked to dress in clothes appropriate to the era and teachers will be emailing requirements over the weekend.

Yesterday I was fortunate to be able to spend the day with Rooms 9 and 10 on their Capital E experience. We were treated to 3 very different performances that showcased a huge range of talents. I know the children were both entertained and inspired and I thank Trish Fitzsimons and Pauline MacLean for ensuring our children have the opportunity to be part of these events.

Next week the NZEI (the Union for all Primary Teachers and Principals), are calling for paid union meetings. We have decided as a staff, to attend separate meetings throughout the week so that it does not disrupt the children's learning. We all appreciate the support we are receiving from the whole community and are holding out hope for a prompt resolution so that the strike scheduled for 3 April does not need to go ahead.
