Family Zone Cyber Safety Hub - Family Zone helps keep kids safe online when they access the Internet through the School's network. Our goal is to protect every student from online harm while still allowing them to take advantage of the incredible possibilities the Internet has opened up. That's why we've partnered with Family Zone, New Zealand's leading provider of cyber safety and digital-awareness tools and services.

We also have a limited number of Family Zone Family Packs available to give away. These packs are valued at \$72 per year. A Family Zone Family Pack provides 6 Mobile Zone licenses to cover up to 6 devices. Families can then use the 6 Mobile Zone licenses in each pack to activate Mobile Zone on up to 6 of their children's devices. Come along to our Makerspace evening tonight at 5pm in Room 10 to be in to win one of these packs. More information and the link to access a family pack will be in next week's newsletter.


