This term we have been learning about our *pepeha*. This forms part of the mihi we use when we introduce ourselves to others and helps us to form connections. *Pepeha* is used in a Māori context and has a formal basis but the idea is universal. Everyone has a *pepeha* which links them to their ancestors. It's like a story that connects you to your waka, your hapū and iwi. It identifies important places like your maunga, awa and marae. The children and staff are increasingly able to use their mihi to explain who they are and where they are from.

As part of our PB4L focus on our SPARK values, we have been using the gold tokens to reward the children when they are seen displaying our values. The children voted for the 3 options they would like to have and when they receive a gold token they can put it in their preferred option. 'Swap a teacher' was the winner by a landslide and we will be celebrating this next Wednesday. The children will find out what is happening next week and they are sure to have lots of fun as a reward for their hard work.







Nature School NZ Trust have been chosen for the 'Good in the Hood' promotion and have a box in Z Mana and Z Mungavin, running for the month of September. come from money but from God.


